Miami-Dade Affordable Housing Crisis

"The mean wage for renters in Miami-Dade is just \$15 per hour, meaning many workers are getting pushed further and further away from their jobs in the urban core as luxury condos pop up across the downtown and on the beach." (Miami Herald, 2015)
